Operation Christmas Child Kick-Off Dinner

On Thursday, October 7, I had the opportunity to attend a dinner at Thomas Road Baptist Church for area Project Leaders for Operation Christmas Child. This was a wonderful time of food and fellowship, learning and sharing.


When a child receives a Shoebox Gift, they are invited to join in a 12-week Bible Study called The Greatest Journey which teaches them about Jesus and his gift of salvation. Since 2009, there have been 24 million children to "graduate" from this program. One of the speakers at the dinner was Natasha, a Liberty student, who worked as an intern for OCC this past summer. She was at a school when they distributed Shoebox Gifts to the children and the principal of the school was so moved that he invited them to come in and teach The Greatest Journey at the school! These gifts which we help provide are breaking down barriers!

The main speaker for the evening was a young man named Edouard Ndeckyl, from Senegal in West Africa, who received a Shoebox Gift from OCC when he was a teenager. Senegal is a country of about 17 million people who are 97% Islam and 3% Christian. When his parents became Christians, their families rejected them. Edouard grew up in poverty. His father was called to Pastor a church and even though they could not afford to pay him anything, he accepted. This church was 3 miles from where Edouard's family lived and they had no transportation, but they still held programs at the church every day, even though they had to walk a total of 6 miles to attend. A friend of the family gave them a "house" to live in, but it was only 4 walls- no roof, door or windows. Fortunately, Edouard's father had some carpentry skills and was able to make some improvements, but they still had no electricity or running water. Edouard's mother had to go to work to help support the family. As a maid she was on her knees working all day, from 5am until 10pm, so her family could have at least one meal a day. As you can imagine, this was hard on a boy growing up. He was upset over the things, especially the necessities, that they didn't have and couldn't afford. As he told us, this life of sacrifice was "his parent's calling, not his".

When Edouard was 12, he went to camp, and it was there that he became a Christian. He says nothing changed (meaning his family's living conditions), but his heart did. He then understood his parents' calling and he wanted to serve too. When he was 14, he and his younger brother, Noah, each received a Shoebox Gift. Noah was anxious for them to open their gifts with the other children, but Edouard said no. He wanted their mother to be able to see them open the first and only gift they had ever received. Edouard received a toothbrush in his gift, it was the first time he'd ever had his own toothbrush. Up until then he'd had to share with his brother. He received 2 bars of soap, now they wouldn't have to decide whether to buy food for the day or soap to wash with. The best thing was that he got a Yo-Yo. Edouard's family was the only Christian family in their neighborhood, and he was the only child who received a Yo-Yo in his box. All the other children wanted to come over to see it and play with it. This gave him the opportunity to tell them about Jesus. This simple gift broke down barriers and changed lives!

Edouard came to the United States to train in Track & Field and prepare for the 2016 Olympics. He goes back to Senegal once a year to visit his family. I was so caught up in his story that I forgot to ask him if he made it to those Olympics. I guess that doesn't really matter, he is doing what he was called to do, helping to spread the love of Christ and sharing the Gospel with anyone who will listen.
