These days, it is so hard to find the time to pray. So much of our lives are taken up by other activities. Our children's schedules are taken up by school, sports, activities, and work. None of these things are bad. They're just time-consuming. Adults face similar issues of work, raising children, or caring for an elderly parent. Retirees even find themselves doing more things in retirement than when working full-time. None of these things are bad, they just take up so much of our time that we forget to pray. I do it all the time! I sometimes find myself lying in bed on the verge of sleep, then the Lord wakes me to remind me that I forgot to pray.

The Holy Ghost gives us the means to make every-day activities prayerful. One of the biggest ways is by giving thanks to God for the things He's given us. Everything—from the very air we breathe, to the jobs we have, to the schools we're in—everything is a gift from God. We are especially blessed right here and right now. Sometimes we don't always see it because there might be something obstructing our view. Maybe it's stress or anxiety that gets in the way of seeing our blessings. Maybe it's anger or distress. The beautiful thing is, the Holy Spirit allows us to turn those feelings into prayers, too. We can prayerfully and healthily pray to God in lamentation. We can cry and scream and moan at God, because the Spirit gives us the agency to do so. Laments, thanksgiving, and praise are the three main genres of Psalms. They are also the types of prayers our everyday life can foster with the aid of God's Spirit.

This also means we should take care to watch what we say and do. If every action we take and word we speak is meant as a prayer to God, then there can't be room for destructive behavior. James tells us that out of the same mouth come blessing and cursing, but this ought not to be so. Part of living Spiritually is acting spirit-filled and spirit-led. When we go to church on Sunday morning we should leave changed and moved. We should take care not to speak ill about someone or slander anyone. Gossip that is demeaning or destructive cannot roll of the same tongue that praises and thanks the Lord for creating us all in God's image. We have to be careful when we get angry not to allow ourselves to slip into the ways of the flesh. Everything we do and say should be done and said to the glory of God. We do this not because it is the rule or at the threat of hell. We live prayerfully because the Spirit of God is in us. Without the indwelling of Spirit of God, the things we say and do bring nothing by pain and destruction. Life in the Spirit, however, is one where we are empowered and encouraged to make our actions acts of prayer.

Decided to spend \$500 from ACT for Mission funds for a deposit to Praying Pelican Missions to hold the week of June 19-25, 2021 for our next Puerto Rico Mission trip.

Decided to spend \$1,000 from ACT for Mission funds & to collect a special offering on October 6, 2019 to supplement this gift to Iglesia Cristiano Cristor Redentor to purchase Christmas gifts for children.

Decided to collect the Children's Thanksgiving offering on November 24, 2019 & match it from ACT for Mission funds.

Decided to collect the Christmas Joy offering on December 22, 2019 & match it from ACT for Mission funds.

Reviewed the July, 2019 Treasurer's Report.

Approved minutes of the July 21, 2019 Stated Session meeting as presented.

Following discussion, decided to call a Congregational meeting for September 8, 2019 to propose to the Congregation to change the Bylaws of the Congregation to reduce the minimum number of members on the Nominating Committee from five to three.


