Betsy and I wanted to provide another update on Ezra this month. As of 2/27, he is 4lbs 13oz and has begun room air trails (breathing without the aid of a CPAP machine) a few days ahead of schedule. For the first few hours, Betsy was able to snuggle with him, which he thoroughly enjoyed. If he passes the test, Ezra's next step will be learning how to take a bottle consistently.

Right now, he is taking a bottle for only a few feeds a day, and doing well with it. He needs to be able to have a bottle at each feed and still gain weight before they'll consider discharge. We are grateful for the wonderful staff at Carilion; his nurses have been regular sources of encouragement and connection.

We are hopeful that he will get to come home mid-March, but have not yet confirmed a timeline.

We want to reiterate how especially appreciative we are for the outpouring of support and continued prayers, check-ins, and meals. It may not seem like much, but truthfully it means the world to us to be able to take one thing, like meal planning, off of our already busy schedules.
